Renters' Housing Wage

The average rent for a 2-bedroom, 1-bathroom apartment in San Bernardino County is about \$1,253 per month.¹ In order for housing to be considered affordable, a family should not spend more than 30% of its income on rent. Thus, a working family needs to earn nearly \$24 per hour – or \$50,120 per year – to afford the average rent in San Bernardino.

At \$10.00 per hour, one minimum wage worker supporting a family would have to work 96 hours per week to afford the average 2-bedroom, 1-bathroom rent. Indeed, the annual median renter household income in San Bernardino is \$36,039²—indicating that the majority of all renter households cannot afford the average rent.

Homebuyers' Housing Wage

In April 2016, the median-priced single family home in San Bernardino County sold for about \$275,000. Median home prices are even higher in areas of the district such as Fontana (\$380,000), Ontario (\$347,500), Chino (\$440,000) and Highland (\$287,500).⁴

The monthly mortgage payment required to buy the median-priced San Bernardino home is \$1,939 per month. A family would need to earn \$70,492 per year to support this mortgage, assuming they spend no more than 33% of the family's income on housing.⁵
