

Operational Economics Utility Energy vs. Solar PV Energy




Monthly Energy Use vs Solar Generation

Broadband in America



163M do not use broadband

- Major carriers are disincentivized to deploy in low-income and rural communities
- Inefficient deployment of capital
- Socioeconomic challenges preventing adoption





 - 5G small cell antenna leasing
- Increased Tenant Retention: 5-8%
- Reduction in Utility Costs: 20-30%
- Reduction in Labor Costs: 5-7%
- Increased property value: location dependent




- Online Curriculum, Learning Management System (LMS)
- Ability to log the amount of time a user spends on lessons
- Over 100 hrs. of learning plans focusing on <u>Internet</u> <u>Skills</u> (beginner), <u>Advanced</u> <u>Digital Skills</u> (intermediate to advanced), <u>Financial Digital</u> <u>Literacy</u>, and <u>Digital Health</u> <u>Literacy</u>.
- Simple quizzes to improve information retention and validate learning.



Vendor Partner Urban Equity Group (Current grant, 2018-Now)





- Provides refurbished MS Windows 10 laptops and new Android tablets.
- Online Moodle LMS curriculum complete with videos, quizzes, and tools.
- In-person & remote Digital Literacy instruction in Mandarin, Spanish, and English.



Process



Step 1.- Funding from CPUC grants and matching EAH monies.
Step 2.- Outreach Events, Promotion and registration of EAH residents into the program.

Step 3.- Pre class survey to discover the needs and current digital literacy level of each resident/student.
Step 4.-Student is enrolled in the appropriate Cohort and learns necessary digital skills.
Step 5.-Ongoing class with instructors are augmented with online accessible self-paced lessons.
Step 6.- Student Graduates and receives device and diploma, post survey is completed.

Step 7.- Ongoing Tech support is available through in-house EAH staff.

Identifying a Phishing Email attempt

- Look at the "From" address
- Notice the "To"
- "Dear Member" not your name
- Misspelling or poorly written
- By hovering (not clicking) any links, it doesn't show the real company's domain.
- There'll usually be a tone of urgency for the recipient to act.
- Never share any information they ask for you to confirm your identity like PIN #, D.O.B. or last 4 of S.S.#






